IN OUR PARISH

Honouring a Local Hero On Sunday **June 3, 2018, at 2 p.m.**, there will be a ceremony at St. Paul's Community Cemetery for the dedication of a monument in honour of **George C. Eccles**.

On August 26, 1909, the ship on which Eccles served as a telegraph operator struck an uncharted rock off the coast of British Columbia. Eccles stayed at his post, transmitting S.O.S. signals to summon passing ships to rescue the crew of 213 souls. All but 5 members of the crew were saved. Eccles drowned at his post. He was buried in the Eccles family plot at St. Paul's Community Cemetery, but his grave was unmarked. The entire congregation of St. Paul's is invited to join us as a group of local citizens dedicate a memorial to George Eccles' sacrifice. Also, we would like to be able to offer light refreshments to the assembled guests, so we are hoping our parishioners can provide home-baked goodies and beverages. If you do not plan on attending the dedication, you can leave your contribution at the Church Kitchen by 1 p.m. on June 3. For more information or questions, please contact Michael Mavis.
