PARISH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS: Council met on September 18. - A new portable data projector was purchased for use in meetings - The Centre for Creative Living (CFCL) will process their own registration payments in future to reduce counters' workload. - Our cemetery received a \$5000 memorial donation. - Students from Queen's University, who visited our premises on September 20, are doing a planning study involving the church buildings and property as part of their course work - New windows have been ordered for the Rectory. - We are looking at replacing the concrete steps and railing. - A new keyless entry system will be purchased for the lower yellow doors. - Deane has stepped down as editor of the newsletter (St. Paul's Post). - Our next meeting is on October 16. - The agenda for future meetings will be published in the bulletin and on our website.

ORANGE SHIRTS: On **Sunday October 6**, you are invited by our All My Relations group to **wear an orange shirt** to church to honour residential school survivors. Orange Shirt Day (September 30) was born out of the experience of Phyllis Webstad, who in 1973 when she was only 6 years old, entered a Residential School in BC. Her granny had given Phyllis a beautiful new orange shirt for her first day of school, but it was taken away from her as soon as she arrived and she never saw the shirt again. We wear orange on this day as a way of honouring the statement, *Every Child Matters*.
