Parish Council Our next meeting will be on Wednesday November 20 at 7:00 p.m. Here are some highlights from our last meeting:

- Work on replacing the rectory windows is scheduled to begin at the end of October.
- We are investigating options for replacing the concrete steps next spring. A site plan and building permit will be required for this work. A temporary repair to the steps will be made in the meantime, and everyone is asked to use caution on the steps.
- Lock boxes will be installed on the lower yellow doors and the rear church hall door. We are investigating repairs and/or rebuilding of the yellow doors so that they close properly.
- Repairs were made to the toilet in the parish house. Many of the parts were corroded and had to be replaced.
- A new contract will be signed with the snow removal company for this winter which includes using more environmentally friendly salt.
- We discussed a possible Garage Sale for the spring of 2020.
- We discussed the role of the new Ministry Teams in relation to Parish Council and how they might work together. We recognized the need for the coordination of events between the various teams and for them working within the overall mission of the parish.
